

LANGUAGE OF LEADERSHIP Desktop Writing Guide

Before you hit send on an email, always check your writing for weak language. Here's a list of common weak structures you must eliminate from your communication **if you want to be perceived as a leader.**

Soft Verbs	Change to
I think it's a good idea.	It is a good idea.
I feel excited about the opportunity.	I am excited about the opportunity.
I hope this proposal meets your needs.	I'm confident this proposal meets your needs.

Past Tense (when you mean present)	Change to
I wanted to talk to you about	I want to talk to you about
I thought we might discuss	We should discuss
I felt I should touch base with you.	I want to touch base with you.

Mincing Modifiers (those little words that minimize what you mean)	Change to
I'd just like to say something.	I'm going to say something. (Or just say it!)
Maybe we should discuss	We should discuss
I'm a bit concerned.	I am concerned.



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Asking Questions (when that's not what you mean)	Change to
Would you like to work on this?	Work on this. (command form)
What if we tried it like this?	I recommend we try it like this
How about we do this?	I suggest we

Hedging Words	Change to
Maybe we can?	Here's my plan.
We could	Let's
Perhaps we could do this	Let's try this

Other things to check for	Use only when
Apologizing	You really messed up.
Excessive thanks	Once is enough.
Too many exclamation points!	You are expressing actual excitement.

Remember: write and speak in a clear, direct, and conversational way.
